

Linda D. Gillam, M.D., M.P.H. MACC, FAHA, FASE, FESC

Dr. Gillam is the Dorothy and Lloyd Huck Chair of the Department of Cardiovascular Medicine and Medical Director of the Cardiovascular Service Line for Atlantic Health System and Professor of Medicine at Thomas Jefferson University. She is a graduate of McGill University and Queen's University, Canada and Columbia University, NY. She completed cardiology fellowship training at the University of Toronto and Massachusetts General Hospital.

Dr. Gillam has published and lectured extensively in the fields of echocardiography, valvular heart disease and quality improvement. She is Senior Guest Editor for *Circulation: Cardiovascular Imaging*, a guest editor for the *Journal of the American College of Cardiology* and the *Journal of the American Society of Echocardiography* and is also a member of the editorial board of *Circulation*. She is co-editor of the textbook *Advanced Echocardiographic Techniques and Essential Echocardiography*, a companion textbook to Braunwald's *Heart Disease*.

Dr. Gillam is Past-President of the National Board of Echocardiography and Past President of the American Society of Echocardiography and a former member of both the Board of Trustees and Board of Governors of the American College of Cardiology, having had multiple other leadership roles in all 3 organizations as well as the American Heart Association.

Past awards include the Richard Popp Distinguished Teacher Award of the American Society of Echocardiography, the Women in Cardiology Mentoring Award of the American Heart Association, the American College of Cardiology Distinguished Service and Gifted Educator Award, the McDonald Lectureship Award of the Ontario Heart and Stroke Foundation and the Meritorious Service Award and Mentoring Award of the American Society of Echocardiography. In 2011, she was the Laennec Lecturer at the American Heart Association annual scientific sessions and was recently awarded the American College of Cardiology's highest award, Master of the American College of Cardiology. She is also a member of the CMS Medicare Coverage Advisory Committee and previously served as an advisor to the FDA.
