

Dr. James Udelson is Chief of the Division of Cardiology at Tufts Medical Center. He is a Professor of Medicine and Radiology at Tufts University School of Medicine in Boston, and in 2012 received the Distinguished Faculty Award from the Medical School.

He was an Associate Editor for *Circulation* from 2004 - 2016. In 2008, he was selected as the initial Editor-in-Chief for the AHA's then new journal *Circulation: Heart Failure*. Since January 2022 he has been an Associate Editor at *JAMA Cardiology*, and has been a chapter author for *Braunwald's Heart Disease* textbook.

Dr. Udelson has served as President of the American Society of Nuclear Cardiology, also a 5-year term on the Board of Trustees of the American College of Cardiology (ACC), 2 terms as a member of the Executive Council of the Heart Failure Society of America, and currently serves the HFSA as a member of the Leadership Recruitment Committee.

He has served as a member of the FDA Medical Imaging Drugs Advisory Panel and has been invited as an ad hoc member of the FDA's Cardiovascular and Renal Drugs Advisory Panel and the Peripheral and Central Nervous System Advisory Panel. He is a member of the Association of University Cardiologists and the Association of Professors of Cardiology. He has been the recipient of several NIH grants for studies of the use of cardiac imaging to better understand the physiology of left ventricular function and to favorably influence clinical decision making. He has directed and/or participated in numerous clinical trials on heart failure and cardiac imaging, focusing on the role of new therapies and how they affect remodeling, physiology, function, and outcomes.
